WHEREAS: Sexual abuse by clergy, church staff, ministry volunteers, and congregation members is not infrequent, with one study documenting over 7,000 claims of sexual abuse filed to just three insurance companies over a 20-year period¹, and

WHEREAS the FMCUSA does not have a consistent, trauma informed policy in regards to elders credibly accused or found guilty of sexual abuse or misconduct.

WHEREAS in August of 2022, the Southern Baptist Convention, the second-largest faith group in the United States, reported that they were being investigated by the Justice Department for their lack of a clearly articulated and consistent policy and their mishandling of sexual abuse cases², and

WHEREAS studies show that systems and structures in which an abuser operates have often been unknowingly manipulated by the abuser, such that MEG boards, churches, etc., may have difficulty in determining an abuser's genuine and full repentance toward restoration for ministry³, and

WHEREAS studies demonstrate that sexual abuse by clergy members leads to spiritual trauma and is a form of spiritual abuse⁴, and

WHEREAS someone who has used their spiritual authority to manipulate another sexually or otherwise, causing spiritual, emotional, and physical trauma, may not be trusted to properly exercise such authority in the future, regardless of promises made,

Therefore, BE IT RESOLVED:

That a new paragraph be added to the *Book of Discipline*, 7130.B.1.g, stating:

g. Immediate Surrender of Credentials: When an elder is found criminally guilty of sexual misconduct, their credentials shall immediately be declared null and void, without the possibility of reinstatement. The elder may enter a restoration process which could result in restitution to lay membership but not to the restoration of their credentials.
